

- 2) Health education and disease prevention in the Slum of Mathare, with particular regard to reproductive health and gender issues.



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### **Some results** in Kenya




### Improvement of health facilities:

Purchase of medical equipment for local clinics and hospitals and new equipment for the ambulances in order to improve the referral process and the patient safety. A new waiting room for children was opened in the "German Doctor - Baraka Health Centre".

 Professional trainings: Training courses for the health personnel were organized; In addition external consultants (Health E Net) contributed to put into practice new protocols to increase the quality of health services.

 Realization of outreach activities in the community: In the slums of Mathare, Babadogo, Korogocho, Huruma e Dandora, the mothers were called to participate to training courses on the theme of nutrition and breastfeeding. All the activities were developed with the support of local Community **Health Workers and Social Workers.** 








### Main findings about the attendance of mothers to ANC and delivering in the health units (data collected from interviews)

- Quite high number of home deliveries (estimation between 10% and 30 %)
- Where the socio-economical level is better the % of home deliveries decrease
- Probably some maternal deaths occurring at home are not reported
- In case of obstetrical complications during home delivery the mothers often arrive late at the health unit or hospital
- Very high influence of traditional beliefs
- Important influence of cultural level and poverty (social determinants) for the access to health services and for the health status of the mothers
- Fear to be referred to the hospital where sometime the attitude of staff is rude Fear to be referred to the hospital where there are beliefs that the baby can be stolen or sold
- Insecurity at night
- Etc.
